Spring is definitely here and a great time to think about the new life that is possible for us as Christians. As the daffodils bloom, so arrives Easter and the hope that there is more than we know available to us, even beyond the grave. It's an exciting season of our year as new life starts to grow and was traditionally the time we had baptisms in church. I pray we all experience the hope of Easter this year in our own different ways.

Sometimes when change happens it can be a dramatic event, or experience but many times it is also one small change that we make that can alter the course of our days. As ordinary Christians we never know how God will use our hands and feet in every day life.

As a parish we are looking at how we can 'revitalise'. We started to think about this in an away day at South Cave to see how we think we are doing at the moment. One area we would like to improve in is how we link in with our local community. With that in mind I am planning to share a questionnaire after Easter that we can use with the groups who use our buildings, and also with our friends and neighbours. How do people see us as the local church in this area? It will be interesting to find out! We would really welcome your support in asking people what they think.

Hopefully you have also been enjoying the weekly pew sheets we are producing to keep everyone informed about events coming up. In future we won't be producing monthly Pew News, but will instead have a booklet three or four times a year to give out to more people. If you have ideas for our 'new look' or ideas about news stories or information you would like to see in the Pew news in the future do let us know. This could possibly include advertising groups who use our hall or local businesses and opening times for church buildings.

Getting ready for the harvest...

With the news that we are going to be hosting a community seed sowing event this Easter at Brough, I am hoping the following verses from Matthew 4 v 26-29 can help us understand God's plans for us here:

He also said, "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. All by itself the soil produces grain—first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come."

The next step for us on our revitalise journey is to get together to think about the future and describe God's vision for us as a community. We will be exploring questions, such as what would it be wonderful to see happening here by 2030? What are the green shoots that are happening here already and how can we nurture these?cont

This Spring we also plan to capture some of our hopes and dreams for the future and commit these to God together. We will have some help to do this from Rev Becky Lumley of St Mary's in Beverley, who will be coming to join us at All Saints in Brough for a Saturday morning session on May 11th from 9.30-12.30. If you are able to join us please come along. Revd Becky has been leading St Mary's in Beverley for over 10 years, and seen more young people join them for worship and come to faith during her time there.
